## Lady Miners look to continue run of recent success

The Missouri S&T Lady Miners have had four straight winning seasons. For that streak to continue the Lady Miners will have to depend on a young but talented core group of players for the 2009-10 campaign.

That challenge won't be easy though as S&T has to replace six seniors off last season's squad including the school's all-time leading scorer in Tamara McCaskill and one of its best rebounders in Katie McElrath.

The Lady Miners return six letterwinners off that team and will have eight new faces including five freshmen on this year's squad but according to head coach Alan Eads although this squad has some talent it will take them time to find their way on the court.

"It's going to be a situation where everyone has got to find their spot we're going to have things to work on like our team chemistry," he said. We've got to find out who plays well with each other which is going to take time to for everybody to figure out their roles."

Jazmine Bell started every contest last year and is the top returning scorer. She'll be slated in as the starting point guard and will be backed up sophomore returnees Courtney Kemp and Jaysa Blackwell. Andrea Downs, a senior transfer from Upper Iowa, can play either the one or two guard spots, but will probably see

most of her time at the two spot. She led Upper Iowa last season in scoring with 16.3 points per game and was second in assists with 4.1 per contest. Kemp will compete for time at the two spot as well.

Sophomores Brittany Percival and Julie Meyer will battle for spots on the wing as will freshmen twins Katelyn and Cathryn Heil from Dexter, Mo., and Hailee Parks from nearby Sullivan. Percival averaged nearly five points per game off the bench last season and will see playing time at the four spot as well. Meyer averaged only 2.4 points a game last season but is expected to contribute more this season once the volleyball season ends. K. Heil averaged over 20 points a game last season in helping Dexter finish fourth in Missouri Class 4. Parks dropped in 21 points and averaged 11 rebounds last season at Sullivan and was a nominee for McDonald's All-American.

Three newcomers will compete for time down in the post with junior college transfers Fareedah Washington and D'Naya Mims expected to see a bulk of the time there. Washington, 6-0 junior transfer from Three Rivers Community College, averaged 14.6 points and 7.6 rebounds a game last season for the Raiders and was named to the All-Midwest Community College Athletic Conference squad and was an all-region pick. Mims, a 6-1 junior from Moberly Community College, scored 12.2 points and had nearly 10 rebounds a game for the Lady Greyhounds last season and is a high school teammate of Downs.

The third person in the mix for time in the post is 6-2 freshman Natalie Massey from Mechanicsville, Iowa. Massey averaged 11.3 points and 9.9 rebounds last season and was a nominee for the McDonald's All-American Game.

S&T will once again have a tough schedule as they open the season hosting the Lady Miner Classic against Upper Iowa and Wayne State (Mich.) on Nov. 20 and 21. William Jewell, a future Great Lakes Valley Conference member, travels to Rolla for a women's and men's doubleheader on Nov. 24.

The conference portion of its schedule opens the week after Thanksgiving break at Illinois-Springfield on December 3rd and at Quincy on December 5th. The Lady Miners will have a three game home-stand before Christmas vacation beginning on December 9th against Missouri Southern starting at 7 p.m.

S&T will play a pair of games over the Christmas break in Pensacola, Fla., at the West Florida Holiday Classic against Gulf South Conference schools West Alabama and West Florida on Dec. 29-30; before getting back into GLVC play after the start of the New Year.

### The Coaches



Alan Eads enters his eighth season at the helm of the Missouri S&T women's basketball program after leading the Lady Miners to their fourth straight winning season in 2008-09.

Playing with a roster that included seven newcomers, the Lady Miners earned a spot in the Great Lakes Valley Conference Tournament and proceeded to reach the semifinal round for the third time in four years with a first round victory over Wisconsin-Parkside. S&T was eliminated by regular season champion and tournament host Quincy to finish at 16-13.

The Lady Miners made the conference tournament by winning two critical games late in the season, coming back from an 18-point deficit to win at Southern Indiana on the next-to-last weekend of the season, then closing the year with a 22-point win over Missouri-St. Louis to make the field.

Mike Brown is in his second season as the head coach at Upper Iowa. Last season as the interim head coach he guided the Peacocks to a 5-22 overall mark, 1-19 in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference. Brown, a graduate of Drake University, spent three seasons as an assistant at Upper Iowa before being promoted to the head position last year.

Eads has never faced Brown or Upper Iowa.

Gloria Bradley is in her 10th season in charge of the women's basketball program at Wayne State. She has accumulated a record of 108-137 in her nine seasons at WSU and is in her 17th season overall as a head coach going 222-206. Bradley, a graduate of Seton Hall, guided the Warriors to a 7-20 record last season and finished in sixth place in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference South Division with a 5-17 mark.

Eads is 1-0 Bradley and Wayne State.

***The Series***

Friday's match-up will be the first ever meeting between Upper Iowa and Missouri S&T.

This will be the second meeting all-time between the Lady Miners and Wayne State. S&T won the only other meeting between the two schools 70-54 in the S&T Tip-Off Classic back on November 17, 2006.

***Scouting the Competition***

Upper Iowa enters this weekend's action with a record of 0-2 losing its season opener at Northwest Missouri State last Sunday 75-64 in Maryville, Mo., and to William Penn 67-66 at home this past Tuesday evening. Cassandra Deiters leads the Peacocks in scoring and rebounding averaging 19 points and 13 rebounds. Heidi McKeon and Paige DeVine are also averaging double figures in scoring with 10.5 and 10.0 points respectively.

The Peacocks return four starters and five letterwinners off of last season's squad and are picked to finish in the lower half of the Northern Sun Conference this season.

The Wayne State Warriors lost its season opener at home this past Sunday to Southern Indiana 69-68. Chelsea Kouri led the way for the Warriors with 15 points and was joined in double figures by Felicia Thomas with 13 and Deanna Crumpton with 10. Chelsea Davis pulled down eight rebounds for WSU.

The Warriors return only one starter and four letterwinners off of last year's squad that went 7-20, 5-17, sixth in the GLIAC South Division. Brooke Bowers is the top returning scorer for Wayne State averaging 11.9 points as a junior last year. Brittany Smith is the top returning rebounder and second leading scorer from last year averaging 6.4 rebounds and 9.9 points per contest. The Warriors have 10 new faces on their roster this year including eight freshmen.

***Programs, Get Your Programs***

Fans coming out to the Lady Miner games will probably need to get a program just to learn all of the new faces on the team this season. S&T has eight new faces on its roster this year including five freshmen, two junior-college transfers and a senior transfer in Andrea Downs.

***For Openers***

Missouri S&T will open its 36th season of women's basketball this Friday. The Lady Miners are 21-14 in their previous 35 season opening contests and have won the last seven -- five at home. Last year, S&T defeated Lincoln 71-46 in the season opener. The Lady Miners have won 22 of their last 23 home openers, losing only to SIU-Edwardsville in the 1998-99 season.

Friday's game marks the second straight year and the sixth time in the last nine that S&T has opened the season at home.

***New Look GLVC***

After playing in a two-division format in its first four seasons in the Great Lakes Valley Conference, the league that now has 15 members is doing something unprecedented this winter -- playing with three divisions. Missouri S&T is one of five teams in the conference's West Division along with Drury, Missouri-St. Louis, Rockhurst and GLVC newcomer Maryville.

S&T will play those four schools twice in its GLVC schedule and the other 10 schools one time apiece. The conference tournament has also been expanded to include 12 teams this season and the Lady Miners are one of 13 teams fighting for those 12 spots in the field as Illinois-Springfield and Maryville are not eligible due to their transition to NCAA Division II (UIS will be eligible in 2011 and Maryville the following year).

***For Whom the BELL Tolls***

Senior Jazmine Bell is the top returning scorer for the Lady Miners heading into the 2009-10 season. Last year she was third on the team averaging just under 10 points a contest and started all 29 games. She had 15 double figure scoring games last season while shooting 43.3 percent (94-for-217) from the floor and was one of the top distributors of the basketball handing out 66 assists. Bell also finished the season with 10 blocked shots including a potential game-tying three pointer at the buzzer at Southern Indiana on Feb. 21.

***Cleaning the Glass***

One of the keys to the Lady Miners success last season was their ability to rebound the basketball. When they outrebounded their opponents they were 10-5 as opposed to 6-8 when the opposition outrebounded them.

S&T had a season-high 56 rebounds against Blackburn and recorded 40 or more rebounds in a game seven times and went over the 50 rebound plateau four times.

***Long Range Bombers***

Another key for S&T's success this year will be its ability to shot the ball from the perimeter. In its exhibition win over Livin' the Dream the Lady Miners connected on 12-of-22 (54.5 percent) and were led by Bell, Katelyn Heil and Courtney Kemp with three apiece. Chelsea Stangel connected on two of her three attempts and Hailee Parks was successful on her lone try.

Last season S&T made only 34.8 percent of its attempts (151-of-434) and weren't much better in GLVC play going only 87-for-263 (33.1 percent) and ranked in the lower half of the league in three-point shooting.
